8:30 AM – 9:45 AM	The Judge in the Watershed: Adjudicating Water Conflicts Across Jurisdictions Alf Brandt, Judicial Training Developer, National Judicial College Moderator: Judge Benes Aldana What happens when a water dispute enters your courtroom— but the source of the conflict lies hundreds of miles upstream, even across international borders? Water cases are rarely simple. They may involve a single plaintiff and defendant, or affect entire communities, ecosystems, and sovereign nations. In the Pacific Northwest, for instance, Columbia River salmon rely on waters that originate as far away as British Columbia—raising questions of transboundary resource management, ecological sustainability, and intergovernmental cooperation. In this timely and regionally relevant session, expert panelists will equip judges with the tools and insights to adjudicate water disputes that extend beyond traditional case boundaries. Whether the matter before you involves competing users, ecological impacts, or sovereign interests, understanding the full scope of the watershed—and your role within it—is essential.

1:00 PM - 2:15 PM	Understanding and Addressing Women's Use of Force: What Judges Should Know Dr. Lisa Young Larance, Assistant Professor of Social Work, Bryn Mawr University Moderator: Judge Libby Hines (ret.), Fifteenth District Court, Michigan Renowned expert Dr. Lisa Young Larance will discuss the complex issues faced when presiding over cases involving women convicted of using non-fatal force who are themselves victims of abuse. Dr. Larance will discuss her book, Broken, which follows the journey of 33 women "broken" by the trauma they have endured and the harm they caused, and the institutional harm they encounter attempting to comply with traditional Probation, Child Protective Services, and antiviolence intervention programs. All too often, programs effective with male batterers fail to repair the breakage of women survivor-defendants, instead, inflicting further harm on the women and their families. Dr. Larance will give examples of some effective ways to hold the women accountable without causing further harm
